

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. No director with show stock or has a near relative showing stock shall have the power to select the judge of these rings.
2. No person shall make known to the judges the ownership of stock or articles to be exhibited under penalty of being excluded from competition, if known, before, and forfeiting the premiums if known after the award is made.
3. All livestock, crops and other exhibits must be entered in the name of owner in the proper class and must be entered by the time specified.
4. The President, Secretary, Directors, or Superintendent, shall attend each awarding committee in viewing the different classes of stock or articles, and no person other than the judges or officers of the Fair and the groom shall be allowed in the ring.
5. An expert judge shall decide to whom the premium shall be awarded in all rings. The decision of the judge shall be final.
6. Persons desiring to exhibit machinery, implements or articles for which no premiums are offered or not entered for competition will be furnished proper space thereof on making proper application to the Grounds Manager.
7. Upon the recommendation of the superintendents anyone using insulting language to the judges or any directors or ring superintendents will be expelled from the grounds with his stock for the rest of the meeting and premiums forfeited.
8. Any exhibitor who shall make or cause to be made any false statement in regard to any animal or article exhibited or who shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties by conversations or otherwise shall be excluded from competition.
9. The Fair Board will not be responsible or liable for personal injury or loss, or damages.
10. 4-H or FFA exhibits must be certified by the county extension workers or agriculture teachers and must have been produced in conjunction with an approved project.
11. 4-H or FFA members must show own exhibits. One groom may assist.
12. 4-H and FFA divisions will be judged on the Danish System. Premiums will be paid on a 3:2:1 ratio for blue, red and white awards, not to exceed \$1,000.00. Entries in 4-H and FFA classes must be entered on the fairgrounds at the time specified for open class. Open to Hardin County 4-H and FFA members only. Members must be enrolled in the project. Cloverbuds 9 and under, 9-13 Juniors, 14-19 Sr.
13. All schedules are based on Eastern Daylight Time (E.D.T.)
14. All livestock must have health certificate.
15. The Fair Board reserves the right to postpone fair for any valid reason.
16. The Fair Board reserves the right to make changes in this catalog and to interpret all rules, regulations, conditions, and differences in regard to any incidents arising from the show.
17. If there is no competition in any class, entry will be judged on its merits alone.
18. Open classes are open to all exhibitors, unless otherwise specified.
19. Each exhibitor shall show no more than two animals per class in the 4-H, FFA and Open Class livestock divisions unless otherwise specified.
20. All livestock entries should be entered in class 30 minutes before show time.
21. Each superintendent in charge shall exercise great care in following all general rules and in preserving entry tags as all premiums will be authorized upon receipt.
22. Exhibitors desiring to do so, will be eligible to purchase a season pass when they turn in their entry form to the Fair Office.
23. Registration papers must be furnished upon request of superintendent.
